Dear Edgeboro Family and Friends:

For the last few weeks I have been spending a lot of time in the shadow of the valley of death. We have had several families in our congregation (including mine) who have been dealing with end of life issues, both watching a loved one come to their final days, or the difficult process of moving through the grieving process. And now, right around the corner, we have the big holiday season staring us down.

Thanksgiving meal plans are being made (who is bringing the mashed potatoes this year?), Christmas displays are going up in stores, and toy ads are increasing in their frequency on TV. Yes, the mad rush is about to begin.

But while the coming season carries with it high expectations for making it the "perfect holiday" and because nostalgia almost always clouds our vision, this season can be a difficult one when we are missing a loved one from our lives. This is natural whenever we observe rituals that have brought meaning to us in the past without someone who has been an integral part of the experience.

This calls us to once again remove the human trappings (or you might say trimmings) that we have placed over what is at its core, a religious truth. Thanksgiving has a cheerful family and friends sitting around a bountiful table full of turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, green bean casserole and pumpkin pie as its central focus. But at its core, thanks-giving is about thanking God for the blessings of grace, mercy, and love, and we don't need a perfectly cooked turkey or a well behaved and healthy family to do that.

Christmas becomes known for a round little elf with a red suit, twinkling lights, brightly wrapped presents, a nice coat of snow, and all the family gathered around the tree to make it perfect. But as wonderful as all of that is, Christmas is about the Lord of all creation coming to live with us humans, born as a tiny, vulnerable little child. This child grew and showed the world just what God's priorities where; that each of us would have a personal relationship with God; one that would last for eternity. Along the way Jesus would also show us how to orient our lives toward the needs and concerns of those around us, rather than focusing on our own. We don't need any of our traditional human observances of Christmas to celebrate this profound act of God for us and for the world.

So if your heart is heavy as you approach the coming holiday season, know that what lies at the heart of these celebrations is what means the most. It is at the heart of this season that God's loving presence will bring comfort and meaning even in the most difficult of times.

As always, I offer to you my willingness to walk through these days; be they times of joy, or sorrow. Simply call, text, or send me an email.


Christmas Eve Services

- 1-hour time slots from 10 to 11 AM every Sunday, December 7 21 (Christmas Room cashier only)


3-hour time slots from 3 to 6 PM every Sunday, December 7 - 21
