

Field Trip Explores Transatlantic Slave Trade

Central Moravian Church invites you to join us for a 'field trip' to the Reading Public Museum (in Reading, PA) on Sunday, March 22nd, 12:30 - 8 p.m. Our bus will leave from the Christian Education parking lot at 12:30 pm. to see a new special exhibit: Spirits of the Passage: Story of the Transatlantic Slave Trade. Focusing on the English merchant-slaver ship, the Henrietta Marie, which wrecked off the coast of Key West, FL in 1700, this interactive display explores the history of the slave trade. Created in celebration of the 150th anniversary of Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, the exhibit invites us into two centuries of the slave trade through nearly 150 ship artifacts and displays that will move and inform visitors of all ages.

Also included: great exhibits for kids (Planetarium visit and Adventures with Clifford the Big Red Dog.) Seating is limited and reservations with payment required by March 8. Cost: \$40 per person; \$34 for seniors and students (ages 3 to 18). Cost includes box lunch for the bus, museum admission (including Planetarium show), and Transbridge bus.
