Dear Edgeboro Members and Friends:

Can we share our faith with others in our daily lives? Is it hard for us to invite somebody to come and worship here at Edgeboro? Perhaps this summer you could try and do at least one thing each day that gives evidence of your desire to love, to grow, and to share. How would that look in your life?

Finally, our mission statement ends with a list of activities through which we put faith into motion, and through which we can find growth. There is no doubt some of those activities attracts you more than others, and that is where you are most likely to spend your time. But all of them are important. So for these summer months, could you commit to trying to improve your participation in another area? Doing so might just bring new meaning and purpose to your life.
