Dear Edgeboro Members and Friends:

I would invite you for just a moment to truly ponder what your priorities in life are right now. How often do you do that? I would challenge you to spend a minimum of 10 to 15 minutes pondering what the five most important things are in your life. Take out a piece of paper and jot them down. Next take a rough estimate of how you spend your time during a typical week. You don't have to get precise down to the minute, but try to figure out what five things (not including sleep) take up your time.

Now take a look at both of your lists and ask yourself: Do the priorities of your heart match up with the way you are spending your time? If you are like the great majority of people that I know, the two lists do not match up very well. Most of us spend little time on the things that we feel are the most important, and that can be a problem.

Most of the Christians that I have known in the course of my life would say that their relationship with God is one of the most important things in their lives. But when asked how much time they invest in nurturing that relationship it comes down to scattered prayers, and an occasional worship experience. Friends, God deserves more from us, and we deserve more from ourselves. If you are only spending a couple of hours a month in nurturing your relationship with God you are denying yourself joy that cannot be given by anything else in the world!

Take a look at the calendar that accompanies this newsletter. It is full of opportunities for you to grow in faith and love. We have Worship, Sunday School, Bible Study, Prayer Group, and lots of opportunities to serve with others. I am thrilled with what I am seeing in the life of our congregation right now. If you are not an active part of it, you are missing out on a blessing.

We are about to enter what many people see as the busiest months of the year: <u>THE HOLIDAY</u> <u>SEASON</u>. Back to back we move from Halloween to Thanksgiving to Christmas to New Years. Extra activities for the kids, gatherings with family, work, and neighbors. All of this brings stress. And then we also miss loved ones who have made these holidays so wonderful in the past and who are not with us now. Putting Christ first allows all of this season to become more meaningful. Church Council Meeting Wednesday, November 11, 2015

The Church Council of the Edgeboro Moravian Congregation will convene on **Wednesday**, **November 11th at 7:00 p.m.**

Each communicant member of the congregation is a member of the Church Council and should attend the meeting. At the meeting we will be electing the leaders who will serve on the Board of Elders (who look after the spiritual life of the congregation) and the Board of Trustees (who oversee the buildings and grounds as well as the financial management of the congregation). Included in this newsletter you will see the nominees for each of these boards.

For the Board of Elders we have two seats open and the nominees are John Bauman and Johanna Heft. We thank Val Hoff and Ron Heft for their service as their terms have come to an end.

For the Board of Trustees we have 3 seats open for 3-year terms and one seat for a 1-year term. The nominees are for the 3-year terms are Sherri Hoff, John Knox, and Tom Shafer. Sherri has just completed a term for Sue Bell who resigned after moving to Florida. She is now eligible for a full three year term. The nominee for the one year term is Glen Emig who was appointed to fill Ryan Beller's term which is due to end in 2016. Our by-laws state that a person may be appointed to fill a term until the next Church Council at which time an election is held to fill the partial term.

Please keep in mind that the floor will be open for additional nominations at the council meeting but it will be necessary for you to obtain permission from that person for the nomination to be accepted.

Also included with this newsletter is the proposed budget for 2016. This will be reviewed at this council meeting, but not voted on until our January 4th Church Council meeting.
