## Synods in Honduras

Around 250 delegates from throughout the **Honduras Unity Province** gathered in Brus Laguna for their Sixth Provincial Synod from May 3-7, 2017 (above). Rev. Raby Becam (below) was elected as the new provincial president.

The previous Provincial Board reported on efforts to address ongoing legal challenges to their church, the development of a Christian radio station to improve communication in the villages, and the recent move to provide further theological education for potential instructors at their Bible Institute. The Synod voted to disassociate with the United Alaska Moravian Ministry (UAMM), a breakaway group from the Alaska Province that was excluded from the Moravian Unity at the last Unity Synod because of their unwillingness to follow the guidelines of the Unity Board.



## News & Notes

### Tawahka Mission

The Honduras Unity Province is sharing the gospel with the Tawahka people, who are quite poor, with many needs. They brought them clothing from 3 of their congregations. A medical team from Ahuas visited and did health visits and dispensed medication. Pastor Morly Kelley Nikiuta (below) is



active in the work. BWM has provided some support. Donations are welcome.

### Theological Education Needs

We are grateful for the many people who contribute to projects with our partners. Both the Honduras Province and the Honduras Mission Province are sending 3 pastors on for additional theological education at the bachelor's level in order to have better prepared teachers at their Bible Institutes. BWM is providing mission grants to get this started and hopes to find ways to meet future training needs for our global partners.

The Province has an active youth program and recently began a women's network, in coordination with work with the Unity Women's Desk. It also is hoping to develop various small businesses, such as their fish market, to help provide income for the ministry. They continue outreach to Belize, the Garifuna region, and the Tawahka people. The Synod took up an offering to help in Belize.

The **Mission Province of Honduras** held its synod in Wawina May 17-21. Bishop Sam Gray attended for BWM and the Worldwide Unity.

Wawina is just upriver from Ahuas. Before taking the boat ride upriver, I was able to spend some time at the Moravian Clinic in Ahuas and share a time of devotion and Bible Study with Rick Nelson and the staff of the Clinic. A 3½-hour trip by



motorboat got me to the village of Wawina around 2:00 in the afternoon. I settled into the room that they had prepared for me, reconnected with many old friends, took a refreshing "bucket shower" with fresh water from the well, had a delicious supper, and then took part in the opening service of Synod. There was lots of special music, greetings, introductions and an inspiring message delivered by the outgoing Provincial president, the Rev. Cristobal Smith.

Synod sessions began the following morning and continued for 4 full days. The treasurer gave a detailed financial report and accounting of the funds sent by BWM. I had the opportunity to talk with the delegates about the BWM's hopes of moving toward support of specific ministry and mission projects. Reports were given concerning the work of the Clinic, Alas de Socorro (aviation ministry), the Bible Institute (in the capable hands of local professors as well as missionaries from Nicaragua), Christian Education, Youth Ministry, Women's Network, Evangelism and other ministries of the Province.



Elections were held for a new Provincial Board. On a personal note, it made me feel good (but somewhat old!) to realize that the newly elected president, vice-president and secretary of the board, as well as the newly elected president of the

Honduras Unity Province, were all students of mine at the Bible Institute in Ahuas back in the early 1980's. The president of the Mission Province (Rev. José Smith) and the president of the Unity Province (Rev. Raby Becam) grew up in the same village together and are good friends. We pray that God will use this friendship to work toward further reconciliation among the Honduras Provinces.
