Press Play . . .

Above, you see the logo for the 2020 Eastern District Synod, and in the middle of that logo you see a triangle. That triangle is a familiar symbol to most of us as we find it on our cell phones, tablets and laptops. And when we press that triangle on those devices, we can immediately be taken to a favorite piece of music, a YouTube video, watch vacation memories, etc... But for now, "press play" is taking you to an over-view of our upcoming synod.

The 2020 Eastern District Synod will be held in Bethlehem, June 24-27 at Moravian College. The theme of our synod is "Into the World...this is the challenge of our Mission." A synod is the highest governing body in our church and the most important decision-making gathering held, for in that setting the voice of the laity, in partnership with clergy, help

set the direction for the future of our Church. Moravian synods include District, Provincial and Unity.

Delegates to this year's District synod will be busy reviewing, crafting and deliberating legislation, hearing reports, experiencing creative worship, and engaging in mission activities. Unlike the 2016 District Synod, delegates will not be traveling off campus to participate in mission activities but will have a small block of time to engage in meaningful mission opportunities on the campus of Moravian College. Those mission experiences will enable delegates to learn how they might take those experiences home and implement them in their own congregations and areas and/or explore new ways to live out "the challenge of our mission."

A special experience for delegates to this synod will include a presentation by David LaMotte. David obtained his Masters in International Relations, Peace and Conflict Resolution from the University of Queensland in Brisbane, Australia. He is president of a non-profit he founded in 2004 to help support critical thought and literacy through schools and libraries in Guatemala. An awardwinning songwriter, he has produced twelve full-length CDs and is author of the book Worldchanging 101. You may read more about him at

Synod promises to be a special time filled with work, fellowship, challenge and responsibility. Each delegate represents their own congregation, yet at synod their decisions are based, first and foremost, on the leading of the Holy Spirit. Local congregations and delegates have a shared responsibility. A delegate's responsibility is to prepare for synod, reading all material prior to attending yet remaining open to the leading of the Spirit while at synod. The congregation's responsibility is to pray daily for the actions and decisions of all who will gather in that place. So regardless of whether you are a delegate or one who remains at home -- synod is a partnership.

Synod's theme and logo remind us of Christ's call to be his presence in his world -- and the "press play" triangle is a symbol of our decision to *act* on that call. What will that action be? That will unfold as we gather at the 2020 Eastern District Synod and together seek to respond to Christ's leading. Let's *press play*...

...that if your congregation is looking for a way to in-

volve youth and adults in a mission trip that helps families in need, builds community in your congregation, and is easy to plan, the Board of World Mission has the solution? Please consider sending a team from your congregation to Laurel Ridge this coming summer for Mission Camp. Each summer Mission Camp receives referrals from local agencies and matches youth groups and their adult leaders with work sites based on their skill level and project needs. Groups should provide capable adult leaders (1 per every 5 youth) and transportation to and from work sites. The camp staff does all the rest: food, lodging, purchasing all of the necessary supplies for each work site, and providing an evening program and campfire. All Mission Camps are hosted at Higgins Lodge.

All-inclusive costs are \$475 per youth, \$237.50 for each required adult, and \$475/ each additional adult.

Mission Camp 2 - June 21 - 27, 2020

Mission Camp 3 - June 28 - July 4, 2020

Mission Camp 4 - August 2 - 8, 2020

Five Wishes Helps Families and Caregivers

Your Moravian Ministries Foundation in America is proud to partner with Five Wishes to provide you with the tools to develop a Living Will/Advance Directive. Five Wishes meets the legal requirements for an advance directive in the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. In these states, you can use Five Wishes to express how you want to be treated if you are seriously ill and unable to speak for yourself, using a document that is easy to understand. All you need to do is check a box, circle a direction, or write a few sentences. Once it is signed and witnessed (notorized), your Five Wishes is a legal document.

If you live in Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, or Wisconsin, inquire about the additional, supplemental or alternative requirements for a legallyrecognized advance directive.
