Dear Edgeboro Family & Friends,

A new season of the church year is upon us – Lent. It's a season of repentance, which is not only humbly seeking forgiveness for our sins, but an action of turning around, making corrections, and refocusing on Jesus, reclaiming his teaching and his ways as our own. This is the reason why people will give something up or try something new during Lent. It's also a time to be truthful with ourselves and to examine ourselves for the pain, the stress, and the shortcomings that we ignore most days because we don't want to address it or don't have the time for it. This doesn't sound fun, but in so doing, it can lead to healing and hope as we realize that more people are standing with us than we thought.

I was reminded of this when I went with the confirmation class to Keneseth Israel, a Reform Jewish congregation in Allentown. Each Friday night, part of their worship service is devoted to the *kaddish*, which is a time of prayer devoted to remembering departed loved ones. The wall to our right as we sat in the sanctuary was entirely devoted to the deceased. Large plaques covered the wall where all the names of departed congregation members were listed. Each had small lights next to their name, but the only ones that were on were the ones next to the names of those whose anniversary of their death was in the coming week. The rabbi read each of the names that was illuminated. As he did so, he invited anyone who remembered the individual or mourning their loss to stand, making sure that at least one person stood for each name read. After he gave a short prayer of thanksgiving and comfort for those departed and those standing, he invited anyone else to stand who was remembering the anniversary of a departed loved one in the coming week. I stood up. I had not even been thinking about it at the time, which truthfully made me feel a little guilty, but three days later would mark five years since my grandfather passed away. After that, the rabbi invited everyone else to stand, saying that this was a visual reminder of how we all stand in support of everyone remembering a loss, no matter how much time has passed. I had no idea this was coming, and I had no idea that I needed this reminder, but my heart was full knowing that both friends and strangers were behind me in that moment.

We have an opportunity to find and to provide this kind of solidarity at Edgeboro during Lent as we confess and repent and examine our lives. I pray that as we walk through this season together that we may not only experience that for ourselves, but we may also experience our Savior's great care and mercy as we witness him stop at nothing to show his love for us all.



Thank you and your congregation for your donation of \$600.00 dated January 11. 2020 to New Bethany Ministries, in support of your neighbor in need.

New Bethany Ministries is a community of hope and support, serving over 9,000 people annually. We do this with less than 20 staff, which means our community of 1,000 volunteers and 4,500 financial contributors are essential to our continued work in Bethlehem and the Lehigh Valley.

Support from you helps families in transition, including Ryan, who moved to New Bethany's family housing program until he was able to secure a stable life for his four children and himself. Now with a full time job and child care in place, with the help of New Bethany case managers, Ryan will soon be able to find a permanent home.

You also directly support single homeless women from the area, including Lisa. After facing increased medical bills following a cancer diagnosis, Lisa was evicted from her apartment and started living in her car during the summer of 2018. Without New Bethany SRO—our Single Residency Occupancy facilities— Lisa would not have found peace of mind or financial security that includes a roof over her head.

• Trex Plastic Recycling Program—Beginning February 26th in all Bethlehem Area Moravian Churches! Each congregation will be collecting plastic to recycle. Working with the company, Trex, for every 500 lbs. of plastic collected and recycled, Trex will provide a park bench made from recycled plastic. Though all the congregations will be working together to collect plastic, the collection will stop once *each congregation* has the opportunity to redeem their bench. (In other words, we stop once we reach 3,000 lbs. (6 churches x 500 lbs.) of plastic.) *Please bring your plastics to the church!*

Accepted plastics include: pallet wrap and stretch film, grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

NEW for EGive Users: Text Giving—If you have an EGive account, you can begin using text giving to give to the church! By texting to Edgeboro's EGive phone number (see below), you trigger a one-time transaction from you to the church using the checking account or card information that you normally use with EGive. (This has no impact on your regular, reoccurring offering. Please continue to use this feature for your regular offering.) This new feature is perfect for contributing to a Joyful Noise or any other free-will offering, purchasing mints, candles, sugar cakes, or Daily Texts, or making any other kind of one-time contribution to the church as they come up.

To start using this feature, here's how to set things up:

STEP 1: Text "Give" to (424) 433-4362 (4244-EDGEMC). This is Edgeboro's text giving number.

STEP 2: Follow the link you receive and sign in to your EGive account.

STEP 3: After signing in, on the webpage's menu, go to "My Account" and from that dropdown menu, select "Account Info."

STEP 4: Within the first section of text, there is a space to enter your cell phone number. (*There's also a space for your email address, but if you already have an account, this may already be filled in.*) Enter your cell phone number and then enter the PIN number they send you.

You're all set up! From this point on, all you would need to do is text "Give (\$amount) (account)" to 4244EDGEMC to give to the church. Example: Text "Give 30 Flowers" to give \$30 for Worship Flowers. Text "Give 50" or "Give 50 General" to give \$50 for the church's General Fund.

Text "Keyword" to see all the different funds you can give to at Edgeboro.

Text "Edit" to make changes to your EGive account.

Text "Refund" within 15 minutes of a "Give" text to undo.
