Dear Edgeboro Friends & Family,

"The Lord is Risen! The Lord is Risen, Indeed!" We proclaimed these words on Easter Sunday at the beginning of our beloved liturgy, but these words are not reserved for one day a year. The season of Easter, or Eastertide, lasts 50 days. This year, that began on March 31st and it will end on Pentecost Sunday (May 19th). Therefore, we have a few weeks left to continue celebrating the resurrection of our Risen Lord! (Technically, we do this all year round, just sometimes in more subtle ways.)

In the gospels, so much changed for the disciples in 50 days. They went from being afraid for their lives, locking themselves in the upper room, to being overjoyed to see Jesus, to accepting Jesus' call to "feed my sheep" and a Great Commission that will take them to the ends of the earth, to watching Jesus ascend into heaven, to receiving the power of the Holy Spirit with wind and flames. They changed from a bunch of people huddled in a room to a church with a worldwide mission!

A lot can happen in 50 days! Did you know that 50 days from May 1st is the official start of summer (June 20th)? There's a lot happening in these 50 days too! In that span, there are many special days that many will celebrate: Graduations, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, last day of school, Father's Day. Many of us will already be engaging in summer activities and travels, big and small, ranging from prepping the grills and patio furniture to going on camping trips and family vacations. You'll see in this newsletter there are plenty of things going on and future things being planned for at the church and the extended community during this span.

Like the disciples experienced, in the next 50 days, I pray that you continue to be filled with hope upon knowing that Christ lives, leaving nothing that could come in between you and his love. May you be blessed and encouraged by the Spirit of Christ who is with you to strengthen you and ahead of you to guide you. Continue loving and serving others in all of the special days, activities, travels, and events you engage in, doing it all in the name of the one who died, but now lives forevermore.

From our friends in Nepal who will be joining us on May 19th:

Greetings from Nepal,

We would like to share with you some updates on the school ministry.

- International Kindergarten now has 90 children who continue to get good education at an affordable price. Shristi Academy is an expansion of Kindergarten, which has classes up to grade 8, and we will upgrade each year. Our vision is to have a K-12 school. We believe every child should get a quality education that will prepare them to be academically sound and become good human beings who contribute to society. Shristi Academy now has 104 children. Together with Kindergarten and Shristi Academy we now have 194 children with 60 full time and part time teaching and non teaching staff.
- God has been faithful in our journey to educate children. This is so fulfilling to be able to educate children and lead them in the right direction. There is hope and a future for each student despite their diverse and varied backgrounds. We are all equal in the sight of Jesus and we have been able to practice our Faith in the most fertile soil.
- We get energized and filled with passion as we see all these children and young teachers that God has given in out lives to nurture them. We are blessed beyond measure. Amen!
- Shristi Academy has relocated to a bigger facility and still has much work to be done such as, construction of the futsai, play stations, convert roof top to house a computer lab and science lab. To enhance learning we hope to install digital screens for each classroom and add more books to the existing library and invite volunteer teachers to serve in the school.
- The new academic year will begin on April 24, 2024, so when we come in May, the school year will have begun.

We look forward to being there in May and meeting everyone.

• Transition to New Online Giving Platform

The Board of Trustees would like to make the Moravian Ministries Foundation (MMFA) Giving Portal the primary method of online giving for the congregation. By discontinuing the use of the eGive platform, Edgeboro will save \$1,500 a year! We would encourage all members who are currently using eGive to cancel your recurring gift and establish a new recurring gift on the MMFA Giving Portal. Trustee member Carole Schachter will be contacting our eGive users to provide any reminders and assistance needed in the transition. The Trustees hope to end our use of eGive by June 23. As we make this transition with our members who are currently giving online, this would also be a great time for any other members who are not giving online to begin doing so. BWM Blessings Flow update

In March of 2023, Board of World Mission directors gathered for our spring board meeting and talked briefly about a water filter project that we may want to consider being a part of. We knew that the project would meet significant needs in La Moskitia, Honduras, one of our longest-standing global partner areas, and we knew that Moravians would do what they could to help, but we could not have imagined how quickly this project would take off. By April 20th, 2023, we had visited our first Blessings Flow community and now, in April of 2024, we are distributing filters in our fifth village. During the year:

- ♦ about 1000 families have been provided with clean water and medication
- ♦ four communities have reduced symptoms of waterborne illness & will experience fewer days of school & work missed
- ♦ Moravians have contributed over \$150,000
- ♦ congregations, camps, retreats, and more have assembled filters to be shipped to Honduras
- ◊ ...and we are expanding this effort! (Stay tuned!)

• **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over five tons of plastic**!

Accepted plastics include: pallet wrap and stretch film, grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

- Chris Spaugh, executive director of the Moravian Minstries Foundation, was in Bethlehem and joined the Trustees for the first part of the April meeting. He shared information on Edgeboro funds and other MMFA offerings.
- The Trustees approved the transfer of the Nagle Memorial Camp Scholarship funds to the Restricted Stable Fund managed by the Moravian Ministries Foundation. With the completion of this transfer, now all of Edgeboro's restricted memorial funds, unrestricted memorial funds, and the endowment fund are held in accounts with the Moravian Ministries Foundation.
- If anyone is interested in sharing responsibilities of keeping track of the Memorial funds and/or the duties of financial secretary, please talk to a Trustee. Bill Burkhardt is **not** looking to stop this work, but is willing to share his knowledge with someone else.
- Committee reports CEC & Youth: 6 individuals were confirmed on Palm Sunday. 1tsp salt

3 c. Flour

1 c. granulated sugar 1 tsp baking powder

Dissolve soda in molasses and hot water. Mix and sift crumb ingredients. Set aside for a few minutes, then add vinegar and let this work a few minutes. Put half of the liquid in the bottom of three 8-inch pie crusts. Add crumbles (reserve about 1c.) then remaining liquid. Put remaining crumbs on top. Bake at 350 degrees for about 40 minutes!
