Dear Edgeboro Friends & Family,

Every other June is an important time in the life of Edgeboro's region of the Moravian Church. This is when our synods of a district and provincial level take place. The Eastern District Synod (Theme: "It's **Your** Call") will take place on the south campus of Moravian University on June 26-29. Please pray for this special gathering. Along with making this prayer request, here are some details about this event.

What Is District Synod? – "A District Synod is a gathering of representatives from Moravian congregations belonging to a District (a subdivision) within a Province of the Moravian Church. Its purpose is to confirm, renew, and establish bonds of Christian love and fellowship both among individual members and between congregations and to stimulate and strengthen ministry undertaken together. Significantly, in the Moravian Church the majority of those in attendance at synods are lay persons, rather than clergy. Such representation is reflective of the church's conviction that sharing the good news of Jesus Christ is the calling of the entire church, rather than a task restricted to those called to ordained ministry." (*Rev. Derek French, Nazareth Moravian*)

Synod Committees – The number of ideas, issues, and topics addressed at a synod depend on the proposals and reports received, the conversations within synod committees, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. To give you a general idea of what will be covered at synod, here is a listing of the synod committees, each one named after something we are called to do as a church: Public Witness, Spiritual Formation, Lay Discipleship, Personal Witness, Stewardship, Pastoral Leadership, Finance, Administration, Renewal, and Vision.

People Involved – This District Synod will have 145 voting delegates (lay and ordained, mostly lay) from each congregation and ministry placement in the Eastern District (from Ohio to New York, from Toronto to Washington D.C.). It's very important to note that while each delegate comes from a Moravian congregation or ministry, they do not come representing any views of any other group or person. They come with an open mind and heart, ready to respond to the movement and guidance of the Holy Spirit. These are the individuals from Edgeboro who are delegates that this year's synod: Rev. Dan Miller, Amanda Borowski, Gayle Justice, Andrew Miller (district youth delegate), and Sue Testa.

For each lay delegate, alternate delegates must be named to attend synod just in case a delegate cannot attend. While it's likely they won't need to attend synod, they still must be prepared to step in at a moment's notice. Edgeboro is grateful for Olivia Lieberman, Becky Miller, and Spencer Smith for filling these roles.

In addition to the delegates, there are many others who have worked and who will work behind the scenes to make sure this synod runs smoothly. These are the individuals from Edgeboro doing this: Johanna Heft (Administration), Carole Schachter (Head Page), and Mike Riess (Photography, Video, and head of a Moravian agency – The Interprovincial Board of Communication).

More information, stories, initiatives, and statements that come from this synod will be widely shared afterward. With all of this in mind, please pray for this upcoming synod.

- **Edgeboro's Transition to New Online Giving Platform**—The Board of Trustees would like to make the Moravian Ministries Foundation (MMFA) Giving Portal the primary method of online giving for the congregation. By discontinuing the use of the eGive platform, Edgeboro will save \$1,500 a year! We would encourage all members who are currently using eGive to cancel your recurring gift and establish a new recurring gift on the MMFA Giving Portal. Trustee member Carole Schachter will be contacting our eGive users to provide any reminders and assistance needed in the transition. **The Trustees hope to end our use of eGive by June 23.** As we make this transition with our members who are currently giving online, this would also be a great time for any other members who are not giving online to begin doing so. INDOOR DROP-OFF—Bring all items to the donation room (“Old office”).

OUTDOOR DROP-OFF—Place your items in the donation drop-off shed located at the corner of the building right off the parking lot.

- **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over five tons of plastic!**

Accepted plastics include: pallet wrap and stretch film, grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

Elders

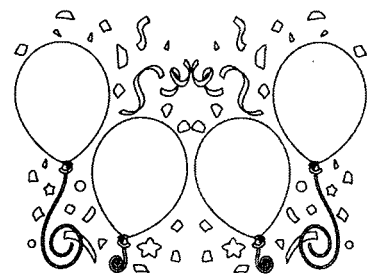
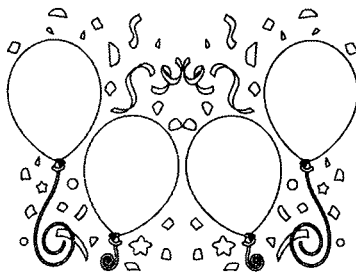
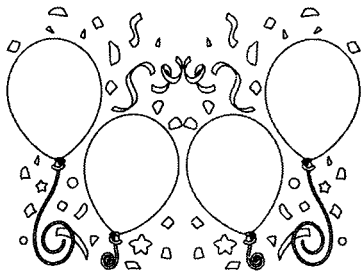
- The Elders last met on Thursday, May 7th. Their next meetings will be on Thursday, June 6th and Thursday, August 1st.
- Get well, congratulations, condolences, anniversary, and birthday cards were written to send and signed by the Elders to various church members.
- The Elders approved the adult baptism of Daniel Hogan, which took place on Sunday, May 26th.
- Pastor Dan reported that there are a number of people who would like to become new members of the church. He has been hosting meetings and classes for these new members.
- Pastor Dan will be away on vacation and at camp on July 7, 14, and 21. The Elders discussed worship coverage possibilities for July.
- The Elders decided to discontinue the use of Communion cards. This was done for the following reasons: (1) Holy Communion records were never complete since not everyone used the cards. (2) After reviewing the church’s by-laws, the Elders found that the only reason given to keep records of Holy Communion was to determine if a church member excluded themselves from the congregation. The by-laws state that if a member does not take Holy Communion for a year, the Elders *may* remove them from membership. It is not likely the Elders would do this, but if the Elders would ever so choose, cards would not be needed since each worship service is livestreamed and recorded.

Trustees

- The Trustees last met on Thursday, May 16th. The Trustees will meet next on Thursday, June 20th and Thursday, July 25th.
- Ben Courtade was present to discuss options for his Eagle Scout project. The Trustees chose paint colors, floor tiles, and molding and discussed other options for the design of the donation room. Work will be done on the donation room over the summer.
- The Trustees reviewed fund advisors and representatives for all of Edgeboro’s funds held by the Moravian Ministries Foundation. More information is needed to complete Edgeboro’s self-established procedures and safeguards for changing account information and making withdrawals.
- The Trustees discussed how to display online giving information in the pews during worship. The Trustees needed to see more drafts of writing to determine proper communications.
- Jack Nagle and the Trustees worked together to increase the amount given per Edgeboro camper from the Nagle Camp Memorial Scholarship fund to \$100/camper.
- The Trustees discussed updating and creating church procedures and policies for a number of things around the church. This will most certainly be an ongoing project.

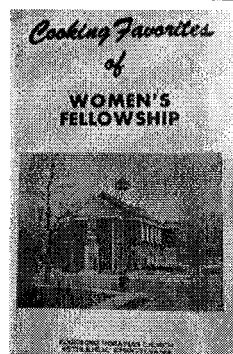

A BLAST FROM THE PAST (1966)

Shrimp Creole from Mrs. Peter Fahs

- | | |
|---|--------------------------|
| 1/4 c. flour | 1 lemon slice |
| 1/3 c. shortening | 4 c. cooked rice |
| 1/2 c. chopped onion plus
2 chopped green onions | 1 c. water |
| 1/2 c. diced green pepper | 1 can (8oz) tomato sauce |
| 1/2 c. sliced celery | 1 1/2 tsp. salt |
| 1/4 c. minced fresh parsley | 2 bay leaves |
| 4 garlic cloves, chopped | 1/2 tsp. crushed thyme |
| 2 cans (4.5 oz. each) shrimp | 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper |

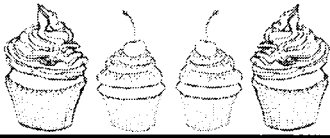
Heat shortening in a heavy pan and blend in the flour. Cook over medium high heat until roux is golden brown, stirring constantly. Add vegetables and cook and stir 2 minutes. Add water, tomato sauce, dry seasoning and lemon. Turn heat low, cover pan closely and simmer 20 minutes. Stir occasionally. Add shrimp and heat. Serve over fluffy rice.

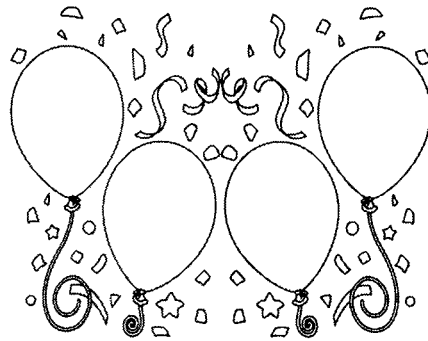

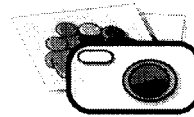

A BLAST FROM THE PAST (1966)

Cole Slaw w/ Boiled Dressing
from Mrs. Harry Gross

- | | |
|--------------------|----------------------|
| 1 1/2 tsp. flour | 3 egg yolks |
| 2 tsp. dry mustard | 1/3 c. water |
| 5 tsp. sugar | 1/3 c. vinegar |
| 1 tsp. salt | 1/3 c. light cream |
| Dash pepper | 5 c. finely shredded |
| 1/8 tsp. paprika | cabbage |

Combine ingredients, except cream and cabbage, in order. Mix well. Place in top of double boiler & cook over hot water (not boiling) until thick & smooth (about 8 minutes), stirring constantly. Cool, add cream. Pour over cabbage and mix lightly. Makes 6-8 servings, If desired, cooked mixture may be cooled & stored in refrigerator. Add milk before using.

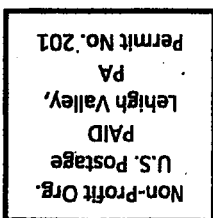
