World Heritage Inscription for the Moravian Settlements of Bethlehem, Christiansfeld, Gracehill, and Herrnhut The Rt. Rev. Chris Giesler

On July 26, 2024, the World Heritage Committee of the United Nations voted to inscribe three historic Moravian Settlements as World Heritage Sites. These settlements include Herrnhut, Germany; Bethlehem, PA; and Gracehill, Northern Ireland. They join the settlement in Christianfeld, Denmark, which had already been inscribed in 2015. These four Moravian settlements now form one World Heritage designation. It is a remarkable affirmation of the Moravian Church's influence worldwide.

It was an honor for me to represent the entire Moravian Unity as the organization met in New Delhi, India, and considered our nomination to be part of this unique international designation. I accepted the invitation to participate in this process with mixed emotions, knowing it came because of my dear brother Hopeton Clennon's passing. Over the years, he and a group of historians and civic leaders from each of these locations had worked for over twenty years to move this process forward. I cannot begin to describe how complicated this process was.

Once our nomination was presented, it was evident that all of that hard work had paid off, as it was unanimously approved by the body. While the nomination primarily focused on the property and buildings, the outstanding universal value is in what happened within these sacred places. For it is within these buildings that community was fostered, equality was held up, education was extended to all, faith was nurtured, voices joined in worship, and disciples of Christ were sent into the world to be the compassion of Christ.

Our commendation emphasized the essential point that today, vital faith communities maintain the properties but, more importantly, continue to carry out the mission. Furthermore, it is important to note that while these four settlements were noted in this nomination, the entire Moravian Unity is

a part of this honor, for we all carry forward these same enduring values of compassion for others, equality, education, worship, and service to those in need.

Do You Have a Minute? (To Get Scammed) A Message from Mark Santore, Northern Province IT Manager

The Moravian Church is under constant attack by "spear phishing" scammers. In a spear phishing attack, the scammer takes the time to research an organization (such as your congregation) and then forges an e-mail to one member of the organization that appears to be from another member of the organization.

The gift card scam is a very common form of spear phishing attack. The first e-mail sent from the scammer, which appears to be from someone you know, almost always starts out with the phrase "Do you have a minute?" If you reply to the e-mail, the attacker tells you that they can't get to the phone right now, but they need you to order some gift cards for them. Of course the gift cards are a surprise for someone, so don't tell anyone! Once you purchase the cards, they ask you to send a photo of the numbers on the cards. Once you do that, the scammer has successfully stolen your money.

Here are some of the tell-tale signs of on online scam:

- It involves money.
- There is urgency.
- The e-mail is unsolicited and just arrives "out of the blue."
- The e-mail appears to be sent from someone you don't know.
- The e-mail appears to be sent from someone you DO know (spear phishing).
- The sender of the e-mail tells you not to tell anyone.
- The return e-mail address seems odd.
- There are errors in the spelling, punctuation, and grammar in the text of the e-mail.
- You are being asked to "log in" to a web page for whatever reason.

If you think you may be getting scammed, stop and think! In the case of a spear phishing scam, just call the person that supposedly sent you the e-mail. If you somehow end up on the phone with a scammer, the absolute last thing they want is for you to hang up. They want to keep you in an emotional state so you are not thinking clearly. Just hang up and talk to someone you trust.

Please take the time to speak with your senior friends and family. Make sure they understand how these scams work, and the very real possibility of having their money stolen. It happens every day!

Moravian Disaster Response: Hurricanes Debby and Beryl



Mission Minute: Hispanic Heritage Month

Board of World Mission staff members, as well as several Northern and Southern Province clergy members, are currently completing a six-month program offered by the Centro Latino at Fuller Theological Seminary to equip churches, ministries, and Christian organizations with biblical and theological resources and organizing tools so they can effectively respond to the current reality of the immigrant community in the U.S.

Since April of this year, the group has been meeting once a month to reflect on the coursework and affirm God's call for compassion, justice, and love toward all people, including those affected by the U.S. immigration system. This issue challenges Christians to live out the values of hospitality and mercy, recognizing the dignity of every individual. Addressing immigration issues through this lens emphasizes the importance of humane treatment, protection of the vulnerable, and advocating for policies that reflect the principles of justice and compassion, ensuring that the needs of the marginalized are met in alignment with God's call to love our neighbors.

The Moravian Church in North America is already serving the Hispanic community, including many immigrants, in ministries such as Estamos Unidos Moravian Ministry, Esperanza for Bethlehem, and many congregations, especially in the Florida-Georgia District. Our goal is to use mission as a framework for understanding the challenges currently facing the immigrant community and utilizing best practices to expand our response to this need through our ministries and congregations.

Planning has already begun for the 2025 camp season, which we will expand to 3 weeklong camps.


