# Investing

Her children were quite surprised to find that Mother did not have a single dime to her name upon her death. A woman with such a frugal lifestyle was surely storing away and planning to leave a hefty inheritance for her offspring. They wondered, where did all the money go? They searched. Perhaps she stuffed it away in a freezer or a floorboard. She meticulously covered her tracks and left no trace of spending or saving it all.

Months later a clue arrived in a returned letter to her vacant address, in a shattered envelope but with the letter still intact. Her children read what was likely her last correspondence, dated just days before her death, to a family in a remote village on the other side of the world. In the letter, she not only introduced herself as a "privileged American," but she was generously looking for ways to "Go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor" (Mark 10:21). It was clear from the rest of the letter that this wasn't the only attempt to send cash across the sea.

It was her final sentence that brought tears to their eyes. She wrote, "I'm just trying to make it easier for God to welcome me into the kingdom. Mark 10:25."

Now they knew where all the money had gone over the years. It had been invested—not in an institution buying securities, but in God's kingdom, buying opportunities for those underserved to both hear the gospel and be nourished.

What was her return on investment? A treasure equaling a hundredfold. And the value of her inheritance? A legacy of generosity and possibility in hopes that many will follow in Jesus' name.

Regardless of where we come from.


May we find healing and acceptance with you





## Moravian Disaster Response to Hurricane Helene UPDATE 10/1/24

The Board of World Mission is the agency that coordinates the North American Moravian response to disasters around the world. While

Hurricane Helene came ashore as a category four hurricane in Florida's panhandle, some of its most significant damage came in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Tennessee and North Carolina. Laurel Ridge, the Moravian Camp and Conference Center in North Carolina, is located about 40 miles east of Boone, right in the middle of one of these hard-hit areas. This region received more than 20 inches of rain with sustained winds of over 50 mph. This has caused widespread power outages, landslides, downed trees, and severe flooding. Laurel Ridge has sustained water damage in Higgins Lodge and several of the summer camp cabins. High winds have brought down a large number of trees, and they are currently without power, which may not be restored for another two weeks. In addition, the summer camp lake dam has had a mudslide, and engineers are currently inspecting it.

The Board Of World Mission is partnering with our friends at Laurel Ridge to help with cleanup, as well as to assist them as they reach out to their neighbors in need. In the short term, the camp will be seeking to distribute food and supplies to their neighbors as well as cleaning up the camp grounds, and repairing their buildings. Then, in the longer term they will look to host mission teams to help with projects on the camp, but also in the homes of those who live around the camp. Please stay tuned at MoravianMission.org for more details as they become available.
