Dear Edgeboro Family & Friends,

As many of you now know, I recently announced that I will begin a new chapter of ministry with the Board of World Mission in February. This was such a difficult announcement for me to make since I love Edgeboro dearly. I will take every opportunity I have, including this one, to thank you for the incredible amount of support I have received from you all since I made that announcement. I am incredibly humbled and grateful.

I recently realized that I only have three more newsletter issues to write, and so I thought it would be a good opportunity to revisit some of my "greatest hits" in terms of newsletter articles. I wrote the following Christmas-themed article in 2020 when it was apparent that we would worship from home for Christmas Eve during the height of the pandemic, and you'll hear some references to that below, still, the message of hope still holds true for us today!

Like many of you, I have my list of go-to Christmas movies. If I don't watch them, Christmas doesn't feel complete. A Charlie Brown Christmas is on that list for me. I watched it recently and then read an online article about it shortly after which pointed out a great piece of what could be Charlie Brown trivia that made me go back and watch it again.

It was about that good ol' beloved blanket that Linus never leaves behind. He travels with it everywhere. In this Christmas special, he took it ice skating, dancing, and Christmas tree shopping. Even when Lucy yells at him to "get rid of that stupid blanket!" (twice!), we know that wasn't going to happen.

Trivia: How many times did Linus drop his beloved blanket in the Christmas special? (Answer: Once.)

Some might say two or three times, which I'd be fine with, but I make the distinction that for the other one or two times he placed it on the ground, it was with intention. The first time he put his blanket on the ground was so he could load it with a snowball to use it as a slingshot. The last time he put his blanket on the ground in order to prop up Charlie Brown's sad Christmas tree.

But there was one time that the blanket hit the ground for no functional reason at all:

"Lights please. And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them..."

"Fear not. (*Blanket drop*) For, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." (Luke 2:8-14 KJV) (*Blanket picked up*)

The only time Linus didn't need his beloved security blanket is when he is sharing "what Christmas is all about."

The only thing more comforting, inspiring, joyful, and reassuring than the blanket in that moment was the promise that he need not fear because Christ and his peace was coming to the world.

We have been forced to drop way more than a blanket this year. The list is long. Unfortunately that will continue to be the case for many of our beloved Christmas traditions in our homes, communities, and churches (see announcement regarding Christmas Eve). It has been and will continue to be painful for all of us. We hope that just how Linus picked up his beloved blanket again, we too can someday pick up with our beloved traditions.

As our plans and traditions and whatever else are dropped, in the meantime, cling to the hope that nothing can take away from you. Be comforted, be inspired, be filled with joy knowing that Christmas is only the beginning of the story of how Christ, the Savior of the world, came to stay with each of us for good so that he might call you to live with purpose to make sure that hope, peace, joy, and love will never be absent from you or anyone else, ever. That, my friends, is incredibly good news for the world. Please don't forget that you are always holding on to that.

Grace, peace, and Advent and Christmas blessings to you and your loved ones.

- ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled over 13,000 lbs. of plastic!

- The Elders last met on Thursday, November 14th. Their next meeting will be on Thursday, December 5th.
- Get well, membership anniversary, thank you, and milestone birthday cards were written to send and signed by the Elders to various church members.
- The Elders approved the marriage request of non-members Louis Salay and Karen Hottenstein. Pastor Dan will lead a private ceremony for them on November 30th.
- The Elders discussed Advent programming ideas for worship and discussed how to cover worship on December 29th when Pastor Dan is away on vacation. Andrew Miller will be preaching on December 29th.
- The Elders continue to work with the church office to reconcile and update the accuracy of church membership records.

Trustees

- The Trustees last met on November 21st. The Trustees will meet next on Thursday, January 23rd and a year end meeting Sunday, January 5th after church.
- Committee Reports from CEC & Youth (Dec. 1 Advent Program, Dec. 22 Pageant & Musicale), Elders, Evangelism, Fellowship & House, Putz (Extravaganza raised \$3000+), Finance & Audit, Stewardship, Nominating, Church Staff Annual Reviews, the Pastor, and the Treasurer.
- The Trustees approved Ryan Beller to take over the role of Financial Secretary and manage the Memorial funds in 2025. This has been and is currently being done by Bill Burkhardt. The Trustees are grateful for his years of service in these roles!
- The Trustees were notified that a 4th Trex bench would be delivered because of the plastic recycling program. The Trustees decided that this bench will be the same color as the others and will be kept here at the church.
- Based on information from other local Moravian Churches, the Trustees updated the amounts given for pulpit supply and organ supply in 2025. The amounts will be updated in the 2025 budget.
- Plans are still being made to replace the internet cord (running it under the floor) used for livestreaming that is currently in the sanctuary.
- The Trustees approved the annual maintenance of the furnace. A state inspection was recently conducted and approved.

- The Fall church council meeting was held on November 10th. The next meeting will be held in January at a date to be determined. At this meeting, Deb Weikert and Carole Schachter were elected to their second terms on Trustees, and Val Hoff and Spencer Smith were elected to their first terms as Elders. A BLAST FROM THE PAST

SCOTCH SHORTBREAD

1 egg

2 lb. flour

1 lb. softened butter

1 c. sugar

Cream butter well. Add sugar & cream together. Add egg & mix well. Then add flour until it is all worked in. Spread mixture out in a jelly roll pan, smoothly. Then take a rolling pin and roll over top to take out lumps. Prick with a fork. Bake in a 300 degree oven for 30 min on lower rack & then another 30 min. on top rack to brown. When baked, remove from oven and sprinkle with granulated sugar. Cut in squares or fingers when cooled.
