Dear Edgeboro Family & Friends,

Over the last few weeks, hurricanes and the upcoming presidential election have been two newsworthy topics that have been on the minds of many. Needless to say, these things have been sources of worry, concern, and anxiety because of the uncertainty that surrounds them and the very limited control we have over them. Knowing this, it seems like a bit of hope would go a long way.

One of the most hopeful things that we can remember as people of faith is that there is *nothing* can separate us from the love of God. In response to that inseparable bond of love that God established with us, we are called to and vow to live with faith, love, and hope in all areas of life. Centuries ago, Moravians put this to words in the *Brotherly Agreement*, which has been updated over time and now known as the *Moravian Covenant for Christian Living*. While some of you might be familiar with this important church document already, I wanted to take the opportunity now to share a few parts of the *Moravian Covenant for Christian Living* that I think are very relevant to the things we have been or will be witnessing so that we can continue to keep in mind the hope and love that God brings to us and others.

**As we ponder how to be generous and helpful to others in difficult times,
As we care for the environment and pray for those in the path or the wake of natural disasters, we remember...**

"We deem it a sacred responsibility and genuine opportunity to be faithful stewards of all God has entrusted to us: our time, our talents, and our financial resources. We view all of life as a sacred trust to be used wisely."

"Together with the universal Christian Church, we have a concern for this world, opening our heart and hand to our neighbors with the message of the love of God, and being ever ready to minister of our substance to their necessities."

As we agree and disagree with others, and as we encounter political divides before and after the election, we remember...

"We will be eager to maintain the unity of the Church. Realizing that God has called us from many and varied backgrounds, we recognize the possibility of disagreements or differences. Often these differences enrich the Church, but sometimes they divide. We consider it to be our responsibility to demonstrate within the congregational life the unity and togetherness created by God who made us one. How well we accomplish this will be a witness to our community as to the validity of our faith."

"We will not hate, despise, slander, or otherwise injure anyone. We will ever strive to manifest love towards all people, to treat them in a kind and friendly manner, and in our dealings with them to approve ourselves upright, honest, and conscientious, as becomes children of God."

"For the sake of the peace which we have with God, we earnestly desire to live peaceably with all people and to seek the peace of the places where we dwell."

As we see the ads, clips, and articles, and as we go vote and witness everything that comes with this election, we remember...

"Considering it a special privilege to live in a democratic society, we will faithfully fulfill the responsibilities of our citizenship, among which are intelligent and well-informed voting, a willingness to assume public office, guiding the decisions of government by the expression of our opinions, and supporting good government by our personal efforts."

Thank you for all the ways - mentioned and not mentioned above - that you witness to your faith in Christ as members and friends of the Moravian Church. It truly has and will make a difference. I pray that God will grant us the hope, love, wisdom, and peace to be faithful witnesses each and every day.

- **Tribal Elder of the Delaware Nation (Lenape) Visits Bethlehem**—Join us on Saturday, November 2 at 1:30pm in Central Moravian Church's Old Chapel for a talk by Lenape retired tribal elder and member of the Delaware tribe of Oklahoma, **John Thomas**. For thousands upon thousands of years, the Lenape people lived in this region, until being driven off this land by European settlers, and forced removals from the 18th and early 19th centuries. The 18th century Moravian church was engaged in mission work with the local Lenape people; working, worshipping (and being buried) alongside them in the 18th century. There are ancestral memories of the Moravian Church and their mission work, along with the accompaniment with the forced removals. John Thomas is not only an amazing speaker, but also a well-known advocate of Native American rights and has worked extensively in providing proper reburial for Native American bones and funerary objects which stolen from ancestral graves in the last centuries. Following John's talk, there will be the option to join us at God's Acre for a tour of several Native American graves. We hope that this conversation can continue into the new year as we continue as Moravians to seek the venues to listen and acknowledge the experiences of indigenous peoples.

INDOOR DROP-OFF—While the Donation Room is still being remodeled, please bring all donations to the fellowship hall.

OUTDOOR DROP-OFF—Place your items in the donation drop-off shed near the parking lot.

- **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over six tons of plastic!**
Accepted plastics: shopping bags, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

- **NEW (Through Nov. 18): Thanksgiving Food Drive for Northeast Community Center (NECC)**—NECC is requesting that Edgeboro collect 250 boxes of mac & cheese and 250 jars of gravy. Please start collecting these items and bringing them to the church! NECC appreciates our partnership and generosity!
- **NEW: Pop Tabs**—We will continue collecting pop tabs. The tabs will be given to Leo's League for Pediatric Cancer, and they will take them to the Ronald McDonald House in Philadelphia. There is a collection jar in the kitchen, so please collect your tabs and bring them to the church to help out with this wonderful cause that helps families with children who are receiving medical care.

Trustees

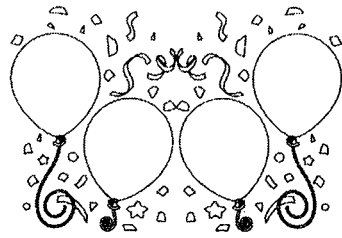
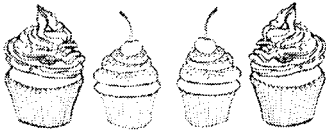
- The Trustees last met on October 24th. The Trustees will meet next on Thursday, November 21st.
- The Trustees made recommendations for church staff salaries for the 2025 budget to be presented at church council.
- The Trustees were made aware that other people were using the church dumpster without permission. A new dumpster was obtained with a locking mechanism. A combination lock will soon be placed on the dumpster. Once placed, the combination will be made known to the congregation.
- The Trustees purchased six LED lighting panels for the kitchen. The Trustees are grateful to Tom Pheiffer for his time and effort to install the new lighting in the kitchen!
- The Trustees and Tom Pheiffer continue to plan ways to hide the internet cord that runs along the sanctuary floor.
- In August, the Trustees purchased a new room divider with memorial funds for the fellowship hall at the request of the Putz Committee. The room divider was delivered on October 25th.
- The Trustees approved the payment to the Northern Province for the Provincial Obligation, Pastor's medical program and Pastor's vision program which totaled \$10,000.

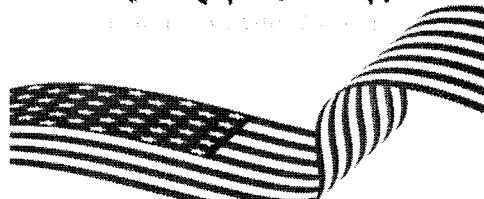

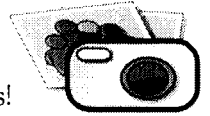

Golden Corn Bread

From Mrs. Stuart Gross

1c. yellow corn meal	1/2 tsp. salt
1 c. flour	1 egg
1/4 c. sugar	1 c. milk
4 tsp. baking powder	1/4 c. melted shortening or oil



Sift together cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder into bowl. Add egg, milk and shortening. Beat until smooth. Bake in greased 8" square pan in pre-heated hot oven (425 degrees) for 20-25 minutes.

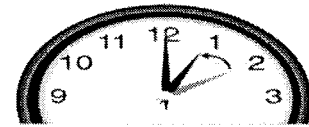
It's time to change the clocks!!!

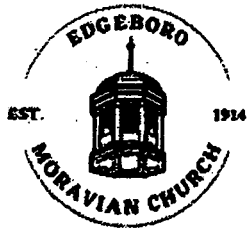

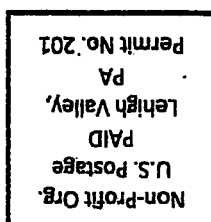
