Dear Edgeboro Friends & Family,

Let's take a moment to look at Edgeboro's watchword for 2025. As you know, the tradition of drawing watchwords and finding wisdom and God's leading in them is a long-held tradition in the Moravian Church. This watchword, chosen by our own Josh Testa in early January, certainly has plenty in it to draw from, proving the tradition is alive and well!

Edgeboro's 2025 watchword is Psalm 145:9: "The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made."

I think this watchword tells us a lot about God, a lot about us, and a lot about who God calls us to love and serve.

What does this tell us about God? That God is good and compassionate. In Hebrew, the word for "good" used here is the same one first used to describe creation when God looks over creation after each day and calls it "good." Reading that into the psalm, it's supposed to make us remember how God is eternally good, sharing goodness from the very beginning to this day, and forevermore. God's compassion as mentioned in this verse adds more depth to the goodness already mentioned with some nuance that can't be detected in English. In Hebrew, the word used here for "compassion" is rachem. It means to love and have mercy, but the nuance comes from the root of the word, which is rechem (a one letter difference). Rechem is the word for womb, so rachem not only means compassion, love and mercy—it means to have compassion, love, and mercy like a mother has for her child. God is good because God forever loves like a dedicated mother.

What does this tell us about us? That we are loved, worthy of love, and watched over. God is a God nearby that cares about our day to day lives and provides for us in ways we don't even recognize.

What does this tell us about others? Notice the word "all" is used twice in this verse. God isn't good only to our loved ones or only to our family. God isn't compassionate only toward the place you live or only the United States. God's goodness and compassion is shared with all people, all countries, and all creation everywhere.

As members and friends of Edgeboro who have this congregational watchword, I pray that you become aware of God's unending love and compassion for you in familiar and new ways this year, and I pray that you consistently remind your fellow congregation members and friends of God's love for them. I also pray that you hear God calling you to love the people and creation God forever loves - all people everywhere - which is becoming increasingly controversial and challenging in the world we live in. May your words, actions, and ministries as individuals and a church reflect God's love, and may you support one another all along the way this year, and beyond.

Edgeboro Friends and Family, this is the final time that I have the privilege of communicating with you like this in The Envoy. Thank you for your time, thoughts, and attention while reading. The Apostle Paul wrote a sign-off to Second Corinthians that I'll repurpose as my own now. "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the sharing in the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

- **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over 13,000 lbs. of plastic!**
 - Accepted plastics: shopping bags, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

Monthly Highlights Elders

- The Elders sent out get well, thank you and milestone birthday correspondences.
- Sue Testa was elected as Vice-Chair and Kyle Borowski was elected as Secretary of Elders.
- Andrew Miller has accepted the nomination to serve on the Board of Trustees.
- There was discussion about letters for membership record reconciliation.
- There was discussion about room usage request for May.
- Pastor Dan reported a wedding request, a baptism request and confirmation request, all for January. All were approved.
- Worship leaders were planned through February with some additional March plans, as well as plans for the Lenten Dinners.
- Joyful Noise recipient for April will be Moravian Unity Offering.

Trustees

- The Trustees met on January 5th, 16th, and 23rd. Their next meeting is February 20th.
- The Trustees elected the following officers for 2025: Carole Schachter (chair), Ryan Beller (vice chair), and Deb Weikert (Secretary).
- The Trustees approved the final payment of 2024 annual obligations for Provincial common ministries. The amount was \$25,310.48.
- The Trustees approved the payment of budgeted year end obligations to Northeast Community Center (\$600) and New Bethany Ministries (\$600).
- The Trustees finished the process to enroll in online banking with ESSA for the general church checking account.
- The Trustees voted to transfer \$660 (total memorial gifts collected in 2024) to the MMFA Edgeboro Unrestricted Memorial Funds account, and they voted to withdraw \$1,446.83 from the same fund to pay expenses for Ben Courtade's Eagle Scout project. The project is now complete! Thank you Ben! The Trustees will purchase and install light fixtures and purchase bins for plastic storage.
- The Trustees purchased three new tables for the fellowship hall and a new commercial vacuum for custodial use.
- The church website has been updated and maintained and the church office and administration is now using Google applications (free to nonprofits). The Trustees thank Pastor Dan for making these transitions!
- The Trustees appointed Ryan Beller as Financial Secretary and manager of the Memorial funds. This role was previously held by Bill Burkhardt for the last number of years. The Trustees thank Bill for his years of service to the church!

• The Joint Board will next meet on Monday, February 10th to begin the call process with Eastern District President, Melissa Johnson.



A BLAST FROM THE PAST

Flounder Parmesan

1 tsp. curry

1/2 tsp. salt

Grind of pepper

4 flounder fillets

1/2 c. Parmesan cheese

from Mrs. Palmer Eby

Directions:

Melt butter in saucepan. Blend in flour. Gradually add milk, using low heat.

Continue stirring. Add remaining ingredients. Slowly cook about 5 minutes or until thick.

Place fillets in buttered baking dish.

Sprinkle lightly with crumbs.

Pour sauce over fish. Place under broiler until a few dark spots appear.
