Dear Edgeboro Family & Friends,

Well, we've made it a few weeks now without a pastor and we are still surviving. Dan's absence is felt in many ways by many people and we continue to see all the areas where his leadership was needed and appreciated. He will be missed greatly and he left some pretty big shoes to fill.

Of course, February 9th, the first Sunday without Dan, came with snow, ice, and Carole Schachter and I doing a lot of texting and phone calls to make sure we made the right decision about Sunday School and worship. Somehow we made it through with only cancelling Sunday school and Andrew Miller was able to share his gift with us when relating his message about being ready when called by God. Thank you Snow Crew for ensuring our walks were shoveled and salted!

The following week, the weather forecast was initially calling for more snow and ice Saturday night into Sunday, February 16th. Thankfully, the meteorologists were accurate when predicting the ice turning to rain and temperatures rising early Sunday morning, ensuring any ice and snow was easily removed. Sunday school was able to meet and the Rt. Rev. Chris Giesler shared with us a wonderful message about Luke's version of the Beatitudes and Jesus coming down to preach to the disciples on a level place. Again, thank you to the Snow Crew for clearing the way to the church!

As I write this, we are preparing for the last Sunday in February and snow is currently falling. Luckily the forecast is showing clear skies and only mildly cold temperatures for Sunday morning, so we will be able to worship together and be moved by Eric Smith sharing his message with us. And the snow crew will be able to have a Sunday off.

The Joint Board has been working behind the scenes to ensure we have pulpit supply and that we provide the support the congregation needs in the absence of a full time pastor. We understand the need to have pastoral care available outside of Sunday morning worship, so we worked together to find a short term solution. The Joint Board offered the position of Part Time Interim Pastor to the Rt. Rev. Chris Giesler and he has graciously accepted. Chris will be in this role beginning Ash Wednesday, March 5th, through the Lenten and Easter season and extending into May. Words cannot express our gratitude to Chris for providing his time and spiritual guidance as we begin our search for Edgeboro's next full time pastor.

The Joint Board met with the Eastern District President, Missy Johnson, and Eastern District Board Regional Representative, Tammy Lavoy, to start the process of finding Edgeboro's next pastor. Information regarding this process has been included in the weekly bulletins, the E-blast and within this Envoy. We've also shared the link and QR code for a Congregational Survey we ask each member to complete. The survey should be completed in one sitting and we ask each member to complete it only once. The information collected will be shared with the Joint Board and Eastern District Board to help in finding the best pastor to meet the needs of our congregation.

The Joint Board asks for your support, prayers and continued faith in us as we travel on this journey of information and discernment that is known as the call process.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD

As your congregation enters this period of pastoral transition, we offer this information explaining the process of call for the Moravian Church, Eastern District.

The Moravian call system is neither appointive (the pastor is not assigned by the denomination) nor congregational (that is, elected by the vote of the congregation). Ours is a conferential system in which denominational officials and the local Joint Board confer in order to find the pastor that will meet the needs of the congregation. We believe the leading of the Holy Spirit is clearly part of our call process. Steps in the process are:

1. The District Board is responsible for initiating the call process. Its representatives meet with the Joint Board to help identify the needs of this parish. Through congregational assessment, the District Board will carefully match the needs of this church with the strengths of the ordained women and men who might be available for call. The Joint Board can also suggest names, which the District Board will then review to discern their appropriateness and availability.
2. The next step is for the District President to meet again with the Joint Board in order to present biographical and evaluative material on the recommended clergy decided upon in Step 1.
3. Following in-depth discussion, a secret ballot will be cast. When two-thirds of the total board membership agrees on a potential pastor, and after working out the terms of the call (such as salary, housing, travel expense, continuing education, etc.), the District President issues the call to the pastor in the name of the Moravian Church, Northern Province. Please note that the Joint Board serves as the personnel committee; the congregation does not vote to call a pastor.

It must be noted that the Joint Board and the District Board will keep the choice secret so that the pastor is free of external pressures in seeking the Lord's direction. Members of the congregation must respect the need for secrecy by not pressuring the Joint Board for advance information.


4. Unless the called pastor feels no leading by God to the congregation, a ministry dialogue will take place with the calling Joint Board and the called Pastor. A member of the EDEB will be present.
5. Following the ministry dialogue meeting, the Joint Board will vote to reconfirm (or not) the original call to the Pastor. This also requires a 2/3 vote of the total membership of the Joint Board. The Pastor will be notified of the Joint Board action.
6. Should the call be reaffirmed, a written reply to the call is requested by the District President and the Joint Board will be notified of the response. If the call is accepted, that will be announced to the congregation. If it is declined, the District President and the Joint Board will meet again to pursue the process further, returning to step #2.

Long experience with the call system indicates:

1. That it is democratic in nature.
2. That democracy can move slowly sometimes.
3. That the local church benefits from the help which the denomination can give and a real partnership can develop.
4. Responsibility and choice are shared by the local church, the denomination, and the pastor.
5. That if the pastor who is called declines the call, it does not imply a negative judgment on the congregation but, rather, a sense of no clear leading of the Lord to accept.
6. That the leading of the Holy Spirit has repeatedly been demonstrated to be active in the call process.

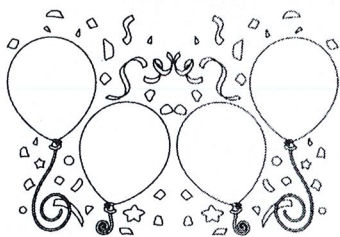

## A BLAST FROM THE PAST

### Canadian Squares

Mrs. Richard Grebs



Cream: 2 c. shortening  
 Add: 2 c. Brown sugar  
 2 eggs  
 2 tsp. vanilla

Add: 2 c Quick Mother's oats (dry) and cream  
 Then mix by hand with: 4 c flour with 1 tsp baking soda  
 Roll dough between waxed paper.  
 Divide dough into 2 parts and roll the first part to fit a jelly roll pan or cookie sheet, then spread with lekvar.  
 Roll out the second part and place on top.  
 Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes  
 When cool, sprinkle with powdered sugar and cut into squares  
 Filling can be 1 large jar of lekvar or 2 cans of apricot butter.

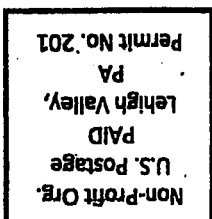
