# In a Word, It's All About Love.

At the center of the Lord's Prayer, we pray, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the instructions on how to make this happen, and the key word is "love."

In biblical Greek, there are four words that translate into English as "love": agapē (unconditional love), eros (romantic love), philia (neighborly love), and storgē (familial love). In Luke 6, agapē is used, as Jesus calls us to a radical love given unconditionally.

This is a world where we are called to:

- Love your enemies
- Do good to those who hate you
- Bless those who curse you
- Pray for those who abuse you
- Turn the other cheek
- Give away your coat AND your shirt
- Give to those who beg
- Do to others as you would have them do to you
- Be nonjudgmental
- Cease from condemnation
- Forgive, and you will be forgiven
- · Give, and it will be given to you

Jesus is not calling on us to suffer from an abuser, nor is he asking us to give to someone taking advantage of us. Jesus is calling us to move the world closer to God's will: a world without enemies, where we bless rather than curse, and pray for others rather than condemn. This alone would radically transform the world.

Jesus is calling us to radically love others and redraw the lines of who we feel is in and who we think is out. Our calling and mission is to bring the heavenly world to our world as we love, pray for, include, and are gracious to all of God's children.

In a word, it is all about agapē-Love!



Almighty God, you are the one who called this universe into being. Out of nothing you created everything that is.


By your power you hold together all space and time and substance.


By your hand alone, Creator God, the inanimate elements became alive so that we could live and move and have our being.

Let us pray together for the grace that we need, saying:



#### **Love for Enemies**





#### A MESSAGE FROM THE EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD

As your congregation enters this period of pastoral transition, we offer this information explaining the process of call for the Moravian Church, Eastern District.

The Moravian call system is neither appointive (the pastor is not assigned by the denomination) nor congregational (that is, elected by the vote of the congregation). Ours is a <u>conferential</u> system in which denominational officials and the local Joint Board confer in order to find the pastor that will meet the needs of the congregation. We believe the leading of the Holy Spirit is clearly part of our call process. Steps in the process are:

- 1. The District Board is responsible for initiating the call process. Its representatives meet with the Joint Board to help identify the needs of this parish. Through congregational assessment, the District Board will carefully match the needs of this church with the strengths of the ordained women and men who might be available for call. The Joint Board can also suggest names, which the District Board will then review to discern their appropriateness and availability.
- 2. The next step is for the District President to meet again with the Joint Board in order to present biographical and evaluative material on the recommended clergy decided upon in Step 1.
- 3. Following in-depth discussion, a secret ballot will be cast. When two-thirds of the total board membership agrees on a potential pastor, and after working out the terms of the call (such as salary, housing, travel expense, continuing education, etc.), the District President issues the call to the pastor in the name of the Moravian Church, Northern Province. Please note that the Joint Board serves as the personnel committee; the congregation does not vote to call a pastor.

It must be noted that the Joint Board and the District Board will keep the choice secret so that the pastor is free of external pressures in seeking the Lord's direction. Members of the congregation must respect the need for secrecy by not pressuring the Joint Board for advance information.

- 4. Unless the called pastor feels no leading by God to the congregation, a ministry dialogue will take place with the calling Joint Board and the called Pastor. A member of the EDEB will be present.
- 5. Following the ministry dialogue meeting, the Joint Board will vote to reconfirm (or not) the original call to the Pastor. This also requires a 2/3 vote of the total membership of the Joint Board. The Pastor will be notified of the Joint Board action.
- 6. Should the call be reaffirmed, a written reply to the call is requested by the District President and the Joint Board will be notified of the response. If the call is accepted, that will be announced to the congregation. If it is declined, the District President and the Joint Board will meet again to pursue the process further, returning to step #2.

Long experience with the call system indicates:

- 1. That it is democratic in nature.
- 2. That democracy can move slowly sometimes.
- 3. That the local church benefits from the help which the denomination can give and a real partnership can develop.
- 4. Responsibility and choice are shared by the local church, the denomination, and the pastor.
- 5. That if the pastor who is called declines the call, it does not imply a negative judgment on the congregation but, rather, a sense of no clear leading of the Lord to accept.
- 6. That the leading of the Holy Spirit has repeatedly been demonstrated to be active in the call process.

# New Directors of Faith Formation

As your congregation learns about the search for four new Area Directors of Faith Formation throughout our district, we want to explain the purpose, process, and expectations associated with this role in the Moravian Church, Eastern District. This opportunity reflects our commitment to equipping congregations with resources for spiritual growth and faith formation for all ages. The Area Director of Faith Formation is designed to support congregations in teaching and spiritual development. This role will be implemented in two phases, leading to the title of Accredited Area Director of Faith Formation upon meeting specific training requirements.

#### Overview of the Position

The Area Director of Faith Formation will serve part-time (1/2 time) or quarter-time (1/4 time), depending on the needs of each geographic area. This position aims to enhance faith formation efforts by providing guidance and resources.

## **How This Process Reflects Our Values**

This initiative highlights our commitment to collaborative ministry and leadership development. Similar to our pastor call process, we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us in equipping the right individuals for this role. Key principles include:

- Equipping local congregations with resources for spiritual growth.
- Partnership between the local church and the Eastern District.
- Preparation and spiritual discernment to ensure alignment with Moravian values.
- Shared responsibility among the local church, district, and Area Directors of Faith Formation.

## Moving Forward

We encourage individuals to consider whether you might be called to this important ministry. We also hope that congregations will help identify prospective leaders and encourage them. This position offers an exciting opportunity for the Moravian Church, Eastern District, to strengthen our commitment to faith formation and growth.
