Dear Friends at Edgeboro Moravian Church:

A few years back, comedian Dana Carvey had a TV show featuring a variety of his characters and skits. One of these recurring sketches featured him and Steve Carell as two young guys driving around trying to prank people. On one of them, these two pranksters pull their car into a fast-food drive-through and place a huge order. As they do so, they try to suppress their laughter, knowing they are about to pull what they think is a funny prank. After placing their order, they pull around to the window and pay with more cash than is needed. When the attendant goes to retrieve their change, the two look at each other with mischievous smirks and speed away without getting their change or the food they ordered. They think they have pulled a prank when, in fact, they are the ones who have been short-changed.

As funny as I find that sketch, it is sad that we treat Easter similarly. We do so by going through the superficial motions of celebrating Lent, Holy Week, and Easter but then speeding away into our busy lives without receiving their deeper benefits.

While the Easter miracle certainly directly impacts our eternal lives, it also assures us that nothing in life is beyond the redemptive power of God, no matter how desperate the situation might seem. On the first Easter morning, things looked terrible for Jesus' mother, Mary, his good friend Mary Magdalene, and his disciples like Peter, James, and John. But once those women got to the tomb, that desperation turned into bewilderment and then to joy. The message of Easter is dynamically rooted in the sorrow of Good Friday and that same power of new possibilities is alive in our lives today. As we move beyond the Easter egg hunts, family dinners, and busy Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter activities, it is essential we ponder where our lives fit into the Easter miracle. We all have Good Fridays lurking in our souls; so what fear, doubt, or obstacle can you bring to the empty tomb? What in your life, vocation, work, and relationships needs to be renewed by an Easter faith?

On a personal note, I want to thank the Edgeboro Congregation for the opportunity to "fill the pulpit" in the month leading up to Easter and through to May 18. It has been a joy to walk through this sacred time with you all, to renew many old friendships, and make a few new ones. My prayers will be with you as your Joint Boards continue in the call process and work with the Eastern District Executive Board to bring the best possible pastor to do ministry with you into the future. You are a wonderful congregation, and whoever the next pastor is, they will be lucky to work with you.

News from Nepal (our May Joyful Noise recipient)

Shristi Academy Update: We are thankful for the approval of Grade 10 from Kathmandu Education Department. We have been blessed to work with 65+ dedicated staff and serve 201 students and their families. The new school year begins April 26th and we are hopeful for good enrollments. We have signed a 3 year contract with the company *Smarterr* to supply Smart boards with a built-in Nepali curriculum. We have hired a counselor to support students face various challenges and are encouraged that some students have found it very helpful. Kindergarten had a formal graduation. Some of the Upper Kindergarten Students will continue their journey at Schristi Academy in Grade 1. The Shristi Futsal (Football) field leveling work is finished. Turf was ordered several months ago, but has not yet been delivered. Prayers that it will be installed for the new academic year are requested. Also please pray for setting up the school library, school staff, students, parents, and neighbors.

Church Update: The Moravian Church is going through a transition as they are working towards forming a District Executive board and local Church Executive Board to finally have a District Conference. Church continues its outreach to places where needed. Please pray for believers and their faith to be resilient despite social and cultural challenges as well as the growth and expansion of the church work in Kathmandu and beyond.
