# "Thank you, Jesus"

Perhaps you have seen the yellow signs with black lettering popping up in yards everywhere, with three words on the sign: "Thank you, Jesus." A homegrown project originating in a rural North Carolina church has resulted in well over 250,000 yard signs sold, along with garden flags, car magnets, and bracelets, with the proceeds going to support Christian ministries.

Whether or not you approve of these signs, for me at least they serve a purpose, to remind me to say it: a simple "Thank you, Jesus." Without visible, tangible reminders, I could go through my entire day without remembering to thank God for all of God's love, beginning with the very creation itself, encompassing all that we see and know (and beyond). God's love has been poured out upon God's creation in overwhelming abundance and generosity, and too often my response (if I remember to respond at all) is, at best, perfunctory.

Mary's "over-the-top" act of love for Jesus is a model. Perhaps we are not called to spend a year's wages on one act of generosity that doesn't result in food or shelter for the needy. (Perhaps we are.) We are all invited to examine our own response to God's generosity. Do we respond in kind, caring for creation in generosity and abundance; using our resources for the good of all; humbling ourselves to be of service to another human being; pouring out something of great value to ourselves, simply to say, "Thank you, Jesus"?


(Standing)



Since we have been raised with Christ, let us set our hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.





# John 12:1-8 NRSVUE

### **Mary Anoints Jesus**

12 Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. <sup>2</sup> There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those reclining with him. <sup>3</sup> Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus's feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. <sup>4</sup> But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, <sup>5</sup> "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" <sup>6</sup> (He said this not because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) <sup>7</sup> Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it<sup>10</sup> so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. <sup>8</sup> You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."


