Trustees

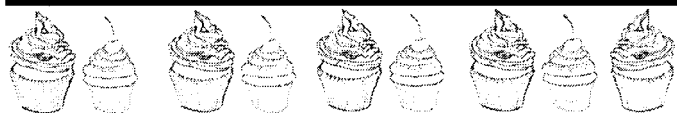
- The Trustees met on May 15th. Their next meeting is Thursday, June 19th.

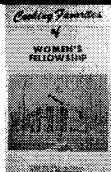

| 5 tsp. sugar | 1/3 c. vinegar | 1 tsp. salt | 1/8 tsp. paprika |
| | 1/3 c light cream | | Dash pepper |
| | | 5 c. finely shredded cabbage | |

Combine ingredients, except cream and cabbage. Mix well. Place in top of double boiler and cook over hot water (not boiling) until thick and smooth (About 8 minutes) stirring constantly. Cool, Add cream. Pour over cabbage and mix lightly. Makes 6-8 servings. If desired, cooked mixture may be cooled, stored in refrigerator, Add cream before using.
