On September 7<sup>th</sup> when I was preaching my first sermon here at Edgeboro, I shared with those worshipping that three big parts of my ministry are preaching, prayer and presence. For my next three newsletter articles I am going to focus on each of those three words as the theme. It has been 17 years since I wrote about the importance of preaching, prayer and presence in ministry for my seminary class, and this is the first time that I have noticed that those three words are not in alphabetical order. I tried to rearrange them in my head and say prayer, preaching and presence, but it just doesn't feel right. So, forgive me for not writing about them in the order that I say them, but this month I am going to focus on Prayer!

Praying is one of the easiest but also most challenging things that we can do. We don't always think that we have the right words to say to God. We worry that we will mess up or ramble and then God will stop listening. We might even wonder if God is really listening. All of these responses (and so many more) to prayer are normal and acceptable. Praying can be as easy as saying "Thanks God for waking me up today" or part of a more thorough daily routine. Any way that you pray is right and God is listening! In worship on the 21<sup>st</sup>, I shared that during the pandemic, I used the monthly calendar in the newsletter to give people a topic to pray about for each day of the month. The calendar would have otherwise been empty, so this idea seemed like a fun way to not have a blank calendar. I also said that I was going to add a daily list of things to pray for into the newsletter. Well, here it is, a list of 31 simple things that we can pray for God's hand to be involved in or for God to be watching over:


