And so, in times such as these, it is important to remember that we are not to be conformed to this world, we are not called to judge other or to constantly tell people that they are wrong. We are called to love the Lord our God with all of our heart soul mind and strength and to love our neighbors (ALL OF THEM) as Jesus loves us, unconditionally. We are called to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with God. We are called to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked and to welcome the stranger. We need to be Christ's hands and feet on earth and to run with perseverance the race that is before us. We have a large task ahead of us and if we all come together and do the work that is before us, then we will truly be living as the body of Christ. # Item Collections & Drives

In this section, you will find information and updates about the different things Edgeboro is collecting.

**INDOOR DROP-OFF**—Bring all items to the donation room (“Old office”).

**OUTDOOR DROP-OFF**—Place your items in the donation drop-off shed located at the corner of the building right off the parking lot.

- **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over six tons of plastic!**  
Accepted plastics include: pallet wrap and stretch film, grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

- **ONGOING: Hygiene Items for Northeast Community Center (NECC)**—In June, NECC is opening a new section of their food pantry for hygiene items. To help get this started, Edgeboro is collecting the following hygiene items: anti-bacterial wipes, hand soap, laundry detergent, menstrual products, mouthwash, and tissues.



We are deeply grateful for your partnership and look forward to the impact we'll create together in the years to come.


