Every so often over the last 16 years of preparing to write my newsletter article, I would ask someone what I should write about. I have received some easy to relate to Christian living answers like types of prayer or love or synod or Camp Hope. Other times I have been given answers like bananas or water chestnuts, and even though it wasn't always necessarily clear how I would connect bananas or water chestnuts to a relationship with God, I somehow got there and maybe some day I will share those articles with you. Today, I asked someone at church what I should write about and her answer was healing. My brain instantly went to physical, emotional, mental and spiritual healing.

Physical healing focuses on the body's ability to recover from illness, disease or injury. Emotional healing focuses on psychological wounds, unresolved feelings and trauma that we have experienced. Emotional healing means being aware of patterns and responses, processing past hurts and taking care of ourselves through counseling, journaling, meditation, and other forms of self-care. Mental healing can overlap with emotional healing, but also focuses on cognitive well-being, improving clarity, resilience and focus. Mental healing involves meditation, mindfulness, visualization, and cognitive therapy. Spiritual healing focuses on restoring balance and harmony across the mind, body and spirit and usually involved a connection to a higher power or universal energy. For Christians, spiritual healing involves praying, reading the bible, and whatever other faith-based practices you may use. Spiritual healing can also include yoga, tai chi, reiki, and sound therapy just to name a few. These methods are used to help with emotional well-being, reducing stress, and enhancing self-awareness by aligning the body's energy fields

So, if you were to take an inventory of your well-being, where do you think that you need some healing to occur? Have the past few months of cold weather kept you from getting out and doing stuff? Have all of the treats of the holidays been tempting you to not necessarily make the healthiest of food choices? Have you been experiencing some physical ailments that the guidance of a medical professional could help with? Almost everyone could do a better job of taking care of themselves physically, myself included. What about your mental or emotional health? How are they? Have you found yourself being more pessimistic lately? Has the brokenness of our world caused you to stop and wonder if or when things will ever get better? Have loved ones been struggling and you've taken on the task of helping them? Any and all of these things, plus so many other factors impact our physical, emotional and mental well-being. How is your spiritual health? Are you talking to God daily? Do you make time to pray or read the bible? Has your faith been tested by the events of the world? Do you feel like God has forgotten you? Do you allow yourself the space that is necessary to block out the clamoring distractions of the very, very loud world all around you and focus on the still small voice of God?

As we approach the end of the season of Lent, I'd invite you to join me in finding ways to heal. The season of Easter is 50 days long, beginning on Easter Sunday and ending on Pentecost. During that time, join me in focusing a part of each day on doing something to help your physical health whether that's eating healthier or something more active. Join me in recognizing that this broken world does not have to break our emotional, mental or spiritual health and that having a committed relationship with our loving Triune God - Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer, we can find peace for our heart, mind and soul. For the season of Easter, let's all focus on healing these earthly bodies that God has given to us. Let us be the hands and feet of Christ and let us to the work that we are called to do.

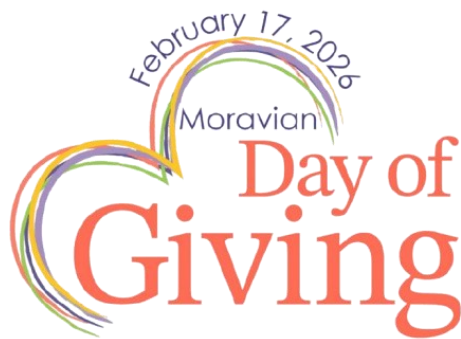

**OUTDOOR DROP-OFF**—Place your items in the donation drop-off shed located at the corner of the building right off the parking lot.

- **LENTEN COLLECTION:** For NECC of new socks and underwear for children in all sizes until Easter.
- **ONGOING: Trex Plastic Recycling Program**—Edgeboro is collecting plastic! Since we began the program in February 2020, Edgeboro and the Bethlehem Moravian congregations have recycled **over six tons of plastic!** Accepted plastics include: pallet wrap and stretch film, grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc bags, produce bags, bubble wrap and air pillows, salt bags, and cereal bags. (NOTE: All plastic must be clean, dry, and free of food residue.)

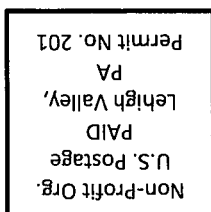
