Responsible to Those Close

As I write this, my oldest child turns eighteen (Lord willing)! She is now a legal adult, and has authority to sign contracts and vote. The legal power (and liability!) that I carried for eighteen years is gone. It's bittersweet. Although I remain her father, my power shifts from being responsible **for** her to being responsible **to** her. She now has authority to make her own choices, and she will live with the consequences, good or bad. As Spiderman's uncle says (paraphrasing Jesus), "With great power comes great responsibility."

In today's Gospel lesson, Jesus gives his disciples power to do what he has done: preach, heal, kick out demons, and even raise the dead! He guides them to go to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel" (Matthew 10:6). He knows his disciples are not mature enough yet to share the gospel with people from a drastically different worldview (the Great Commission comes **after** his resurrection (Matthew 28:16–20). The disciples' first commission is to their faith family, motivated by Jesus' broken heart. He sees his neighbors' confusion, how they are wandering "like sheep without a shepherd" (Matthew 9:36). Can you identify with the pain of seeing a family member or neighbor suffering with sickness, or burdened by guilt, or bound by addiction, or deluded by self-righteousness?

Jesus empowers his followers (then and now) to bring health through speech and action. He expects us to wield gospel power with compassion, humility, and courage.

Lord, break our hearts with the things that break your heart! Enable us to minister with compassion! Help us travel lightly as we labor to bring in the sheaves of the harvest! Give us endurance to face slander, betrayal, or imprisonment, knowing that your Spirit will bear witness through us to your truth, power, and glory! Make us wise and harmless! Amen.

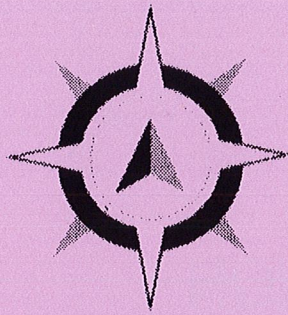
Celebrating 80 Years of Medical Ministry in Ahuas

On June 16th, the Clínica Evangélica Morava in Ahuas, Honduras, marks its 80th anniversary of medical mission service in La Mosquitia. What began as a small outpost has grown into a medical center with a wide range of services to support patients.

Dr. Dominga, born at the clinic in Cauquira and supported through medical school by a BWM scholarship, now serves as a physician on staff — a powerful testimony to the importance of long-standing relationships and faithful giving over decades. A nursing student is currently pursuing her degree on a similar BWM scholarship, and construction is underway on a new doctor's house to support the clinic's growing team. After 80 years, there are always new things happening in this "old" work — from the infant feeding program nourishing dozens of children daily to infrastructure that ensures the next generation of caregivers can live and serve in Ahuas.
