Imagine That Day

Imagine being in the crowd that day.

Some would have come out of devotion to their teacher, but others would have just stumbled upon a crowd. Still others would have come out of pure curiosity, just to see what was going on.

I can imagine the atmosphere that day would have felt like an outdoor concert or a family reunion. It would have felt like a party, like the very best of a backyard barbeque on a summer holiday. People would have gathered, and lingered. It would have been a whole vibe. And whether the participants realized it or not, what filled the air that day was love. A divine love that few would have recognized, and even fewer would have understood. But it would have permeated the very air of the day.

By the end of the day, the crowd would have been tired, parched, and exhausted. I imagine that as the food was passed, many ate, just grateful for the sustenance. They probably missed the miracle of it all. The crowd probably didn't even ask who brought the food, or if there was enough to go around. They just ate until full, and then passed on the extra. In the end, I wonder if any of them understood the event, or if they just felt nourished in the moment.

And when we consider sitting on a hill being fed by Jesus, still missing the miracle of the moment, what else are we missing out on today? What miracles occur on afternoons when we are just curiously following a crowd? And what would it take for us to look beyond our own nourishment, and focus on the mystery of God?

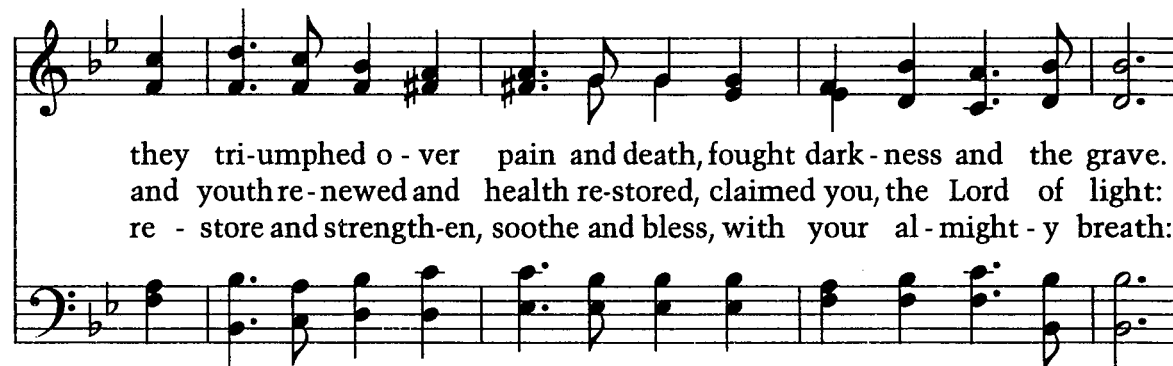
Feeding the Five Thousand
