The Rev. Dr. Craig Atwood is Professor Emeritus of Moravian Theology at the Moravian University and now serves as Associate Pastor of Home Moravian Church in Winston-Salem, NC. Craig received his M.Div. at Moravian Theological Seminary in 1987 and his PhD in historical theology at Princeton Theological Seminary in 1995. He is the author of *Community of the Cross: Moravian Piety in Colonial Bethlehem* (2004), *Theology of the Czech Brethren from Hus to Comenius* (2009), *Jesus Still Lead On: An Introduction to Moravian Beliefs* (2024), and dozens of articles on Moravian history and theology. Craig has led retreats for clergy and lay people at Mt Morris and Laurel Ridge. He has received awards from the Moravian Historical Society, the Wachovia History Society, and the Young Center for Pietist and Anabaptist Studies.

The Board of World Mission is seeking applicants to fill the position of Director of Mission Outreach. This is a full-time, remote position with frequent travel required. Applications will be accepted by BWM Executive Director Justin Rabbach via email – justin@moravianmission.org. Please include your resume, a cover letter, and a list of three references with contact information. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis beginning October 15th, 2026.

Position Summary

The Director of Mission Outreach (DMO) serves as the Board of World Mission's (BWM's) point person for its global mission partnerships and is the lead staff person guiding the Moravian Church in North America's response to human migration. This is a full-time position reporting to the executive director of the BWM and working in close coordination with BWM staff and the Provincial Elders' Conferences (PECs) of both Northern and Southern Provinces.

Mission Outreach is a core part of the work of the BWM — the intentional focus of our effort to be faithful to the Great Commission and to the scriptural mandate to welcome the stranger (Matthew 25:35). Human migration has become one of the defining humanitarian and missional realities of our time, and these global patterns are increasingly present in Moravian congregations across North America. At the same time, the worldwide Moravian Unity continues to grow, with new and emerging partnerships requiring dedicated staff capacity to nurture them well. The DMO carries both callings: leading the Church's faithful response to human migration and accompanying the BWM's global partners.

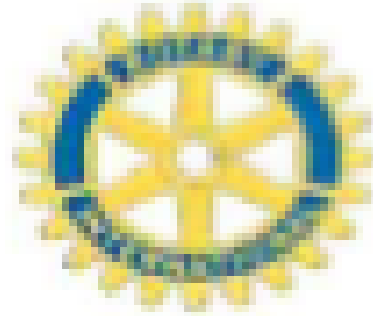

Historic 1740 Gray Cottage Undergoes Major Preservation Project

The public is invited to watch this rare preservation project as it unfolds throughout the month of August.

Work has begun to restore the 1740 Gray Cottage. The preservation project includes replacing the deteriorated bottom course of logs and repairing additional compromised logs. Replacement logs have been hand-hewn to match the original eighteenth-century materials and craftsmanship. Repairs will also include removing outdated packing materials from cracks that no longer meet current preservation standards.

The work is being done by Frank Stroik, a specialist in traditional carpentry methods, timber framing, and eighteenth-century log home restoration. All preservation work will follow the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties, ensuring that the Cottage's historic character and authenticity are preserved for future generations.

The public is invited to see firsthand how this colonial-era log structure is being preserved for future generations as skilled craftspeople replace the historic logs using traditional techniques. Visitors are welcome Tuesday through Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Funding for the project has been provided through a grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission's Keystone Historic Preservation Grant, a program funded by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. This project has also received funding from the Grow NORCO Grant Program through the County of Northampton Department of Community & Economic Development, as well as generous contributions from individual donors.

Properties inscribed on the World Heritage List, such as the Moravian Church Settlements in Bethlehem, Gracehill, Christiansfeld, and Herrnhut, are celebrated by UNESCO because of their 'Outstanding Universal Value' or OUV. However, these three words can encapsulate a wide variety of issues and themes, some of which may be relatively clear to all, but others of which may seem esoteric to the lay-person. Amongst the obligations UNESCO requires from property managers is the need to communicate OUV to a range of audiences. Drawing on examples from around the globe, this presentation will explore some of the strategies that world heritage managers and their partners can adopt to not just keep UNESCO happy, but to entertain and enrich the experiences of site visitors of all ages, backgrounds and interests.

Dr Simon Woodward has spent nearly 40 years working in the field of cultural and heritage tourism, planning, and development, with a particular interest in World Heritage issues. Based in the UK, he has advised public, private and third-sector clients in many parts of the world, including the UK and Europe, the Middle East, much of Africa, the Balkans, Caucasus, and Central Asia. He is a former Chair of the ICOMOS-UK Cultural Tourism Committee and is a Trustee of two heritage charities in the North of England.

This talk serves as the keynote lecture for the Inaugural Conference of the Institute for Moravian History and World Heritage, and will take place at Moravian University in the Hauptert Union Building (HUB).

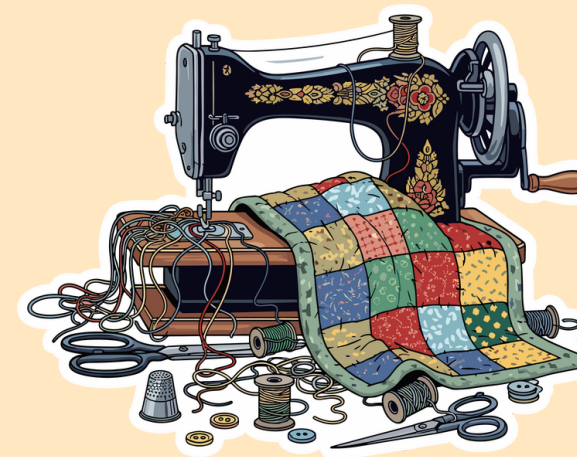
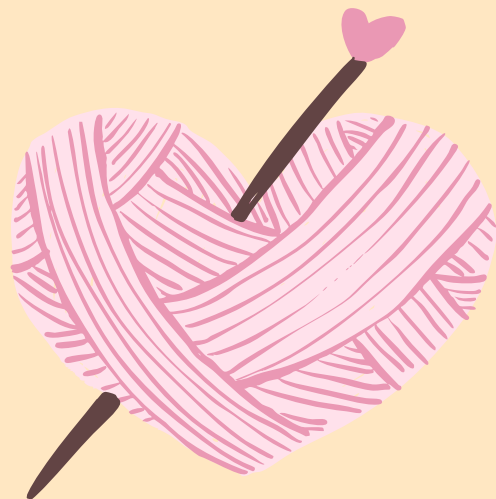


Blankets & Beanies for Teenies
