Do you have a favorite number? Yes, I know, super random question, but do you? I do. My favorite number is 12. Why is that my favorite number, well, the easy answer is because my birthday is the 12th and to add to that, both of my boys have 12s in their birthdays. Another answer is because some good things come in 12 – eggs, donuts, cans of coke. A third answer would be because 12 is super divisible. You can make groups of 2, 3, 4, or 6 and not have anything or anyone left over. So, do you have a favorite number?

I have long thought that the number three must be God's favorite number since so many parts of the bible seem to come in threes. Here are a few examples....

- The Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Ghost or Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer
- Jonah spent three days inside the great fish
- The Lord called out to Samuel three times before Samuel answered
- Three patriarchs are highlighted in the bible – Abel, Enoch and Noah
- Three Wisemen arrived to meet Jesus
- Satan tempted Jesus three times
- Jesus took his three closest disciples with him to witness the Transfiguration and to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane
- Jesus asked Peter three times if he loved him and Peter answered yes all three time
- Jesus spent three days in the grave before his resurrection
- Peter denied Jesus three times before the rooster crowed.

And that is just a few examples of the presence of the number three in the bible and I'm sure we could all come up with examples of things happening in sets of three if we thought about it. We are about to enter the tenth month of the year and the last day of the month and the first two days of the next month lead us to another time with something happens in threes. On October 31st, we celebrate Halloween or as it was previously known, All Hallows' Eve, November 1st we celebrate All Saints Day and November 2nd is All Souls Day. This Christian triduum (Latin word meaning period of three days) is a time dedicated to remember all who have died. On All Saints' Day we commemorate the saints of the Christian church who have died and are seated at the right hand of God. On All Souls' Day, we are to pray for the souls of all the faithful departed individuals.

So, while stores and society as a whole, want us to believe that Halloween is all about getting the most candy and wearing the most creative costumes, let us remember all who we know and love that have entered the nearer presence of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Let us tell stories and share memories, let us speak their names and allow whatever tears might fall to fall. There is no handbook for grief, no right or wrong way to grieve. Grieving a loved one, whether they died last week, last year or a number of years ago, is not a sign of weakness. Grieving a loved one is a constant reminder of the love that we have for them and the important role that they played in our life. Join me in praying for all who are grieving.

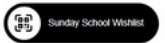

| 1 c. yellow corn meal | ½ tsp. salt |
| 1c. flour | 1 egg |
| ¼ c. sugar | 1 c. milk |
| 4 tsp. baking powder | ¼ c. melted shortening/oil |

Sift together cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder into bowl. Add egg, milk and shortening. Beat until smooth. Bake in greased 8 inch square pan in pre-heated oven (425 degrees Fahrenheit) for 20-25 minutes.
