Forgiveness

Forgiveness is on Peter's mind. He's obviously been thinking about what it involves, especially focusing on how often it's required to forgive someone who keeps on doing the wrong thing. When is it OK to give the scoundrel the punishment they deserve? A public rebuke. Time in jail. Even the death sentence. Surely justice demands retribution! And Jesus has often advocated for justice, hasn't he? Once again, Peter needs to learn—to learn what forgiveness means in God's kingdom.

Jesus uses Peter's question to teach: God extends forgiveness to every person without limit. Like the overwhelming debt that was forgiven through the compassion of the king, the unpayable debts we owe, caused by our sins, are forgiven by the mercy of God, over and over again—every time we come to our Creator. That is the justice Jesus teaches: loving, merciful justice.

We are expected to forgive with the same mercy God shows us. But that's a struggle for us, because judgment clouds our reactions. We are so quick to decide who deserves what. Then, maybe, we'll consider forgiveness. Clearly, Jesus explains that we should not judge (Luke 6:37)—not because judgment is evil, but because it has so many unloving consequences. Better to focus on healing, rather than punishment. God is the ultimate judge, but forgiveness is offered first. Because forgiveness is an act of love.

Some might say, "Well, I can forgive, but I can't forget." So we cling to our self-detrimental anger, asserting, "Only God can forget." But God doesn't forget. The parable unmistakably tells us that God remembers when we show the mercy of forgiveness and when we don't.

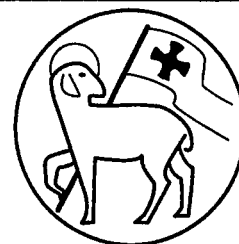
Demanding as it may be, we Christians are called to forgive as we have been forgiven, whatever the person or circumstances.
